

## **CMHC SOLUTIONS LAB**

On April 3<sup>rd</sup>, Radical Resthomes applied to the CMHC's Solutions Lab program. For our proposal, we partnered with MaRS Consultants (from Toronto), Les Villageois (young people organizing co-living projects) and engAGE, a research program on aging at Concordia. We will explore the following issues during the Lab:

- 1. How do we successfully match people to live harmoniously in a multi-generational group setting?
- 2. What types of training are needed to prepare people for co-living?
- 3. What is the best financing model to guarantee stability and affordability of Radical Resthomes in Quebec and Canada?

We should hear about the success of our proposal sometime in June. The whole process would last about 18 months, after which we would be ready to create the first prototype in Montreal. You can learn more about the Solution Lab process here:
